Grade shall be determined by IWLLC staff, based on a 40+ piece sample extracted randomly from each load. If the sample contains less than 50% fir pieces the load will be assessed as Grade 12, otherwise the load will be assessed as Grade 22. Quality shall be measured using the above specifications on the extracted sample from each load. Samples with 90% (or higher) acceptable pieces may qualify the load for a QUALITY BONUS where applicable under contract terms or as determined by IWLLC. Any supplier whose quality results fall below 60% for any one (1) load, or falls below 85% for any three (3) loads delivered within a 4–week period or within 10 successive loads – shall be placed on QUALITY SUSPENSION and deliveries suspended from that supplier until cleared by the IWLLC Wood Buyer.

The trucker or producer must notify the JDI scale staff or Chief Scaler of any disputes regarding scale or sample selection at the time of delivery. JDI will make best efforts to hold quality samples for 24 hours when results fall below 85% to allow time for inspection. These specifications are subject to change by JDI with minimum notice.
